- 6. Only post or share something online with a clear mind. Stay away from social media if you are angry or frustrated.
- 7. Negative online behaviour hurts friendships, relationships, and professional prospects.
- 8. Know your online reputation by doing an internet search of your name.
- 9. Protect your digital reputation by managing the privacy settings on your social media accounts.
- 10. Set up Google Alerts for your name- you will receive an e-mail whenever someone mentions anything about you online.
